- 4. What does Elie ask his father to do?
- 5. When did the Germans arrest the leaders of the Jewish community initially?

- 9. After meeting with the council, what does Elie's father learn will happen to the Jewish people of Sighet?
- 10. There is a knock at the window. It is not until after the war that Elie learns who knocked. Who was it and what was his mission/motive?
- 11. During the deportation, the people complain that they are ______. Why is this inclusion in the text tainted with irony?
